Family Dispute Resolution Research

This webinar provides a bird's eye view of family dispute resolution (FDR) with a focus on newer models of mediation (child focused, child inclusive, community agency-based), online dispute resolution, parenting coordination, and parenting education. For each area, the presenter will summarize the state of the art, including its evidence base. The presenter will not be covering specific studies in detail, but instead, will offer a summary of information and themes for each type of FDR. This is an opportunity to get an introduction or refresher into areas of FDR that are of great interest to AFCC members and all other professionals working at the nexus between family law and family mental health. We will examine what we know, what we don't, and what questions are being asked to further our understanding of how best to use these programmatic forms of intervention.

Marsha Kline Pruett, PhD, ABPP is a licensed clinical psychologist and the Maconda Brown O'Connor Professor at Smith College School for Social Work. She is researcher, mediator, and consultant to couples, attorneys, and judges. Dr. Kline Pruett has a national reputation for the development, implementation, and evaluation of preventive interventions in courts and family-focused community agencies. She has written extensively for academic and lay audiences, coauthoring *Your Divorce Advisor* (2001) and *Partnership Parenting* (2009). She is a member of the board of editors of the *Family Court Review*. She was awarded the AFCC Stanley Cohen Distinguished Research Award in 2004. The California Supporting Fatherhood Involvement (SFI) project is currently a major focus of her intervention and research efforts.
